

Application Checklist

First-time Freshman Application Requirements

- Completed application for admission.
- Nonrefundable application fee. US\$35 if submitted online; US\$70 if submitted in paper form.
- A diploma from a United States high school or equivalent program. Home-schooled students may provide correspondence school or other accredited private home school transcript.
- Official report of SAT or ACT scores for citizens and permanent residents of the United States.
- Demonstration of English proficiency for students whose first language is not English.
- Additionally, if applicable, any other documents or materials required to obtain a student visa.

Supplementary Materials

1. Portfolio, audition, riding or writing submission.
2. Recommendations.
3. Statement of purpose.
4. Résumé/list of achievements and awards.
5. Personal or telephone interview.

Undergraduate Transfer Admission Requirements

- Completed application for admission.
- Nonrefundable application fee. US\$35 if submitted online; US\$70 if submitted in paper form.
- Official transcript from each college or university attended. The applicant also may be required to submit a diploma from a United States high school and SAT or ACT scores. (not required of international applicants or of applicants who have been out of high school for at least two years.)
- Demonstration of English proficiency for students whose first language is not English.
- Additionally, if applicable, any other documents or materials required to obtain a student visa.

Supplementary Materials

1. Portfolio, audition or writing submission.
2. Recommendations.
3. Statement of purpose.
4. Résumé/list of achievements and awards.
5. Personal or telephone interview.

Graduate Admission Requirements

- Completed application for admission.
- Nonrefundable application fee. US\$35 if submitted online; US\$70 if submitted in paper form.
- A bachelor's degree or its equivalent.
- Demonstration of English proficiency for students whose first language is not English.
- Recommendations (three).
- Statement of purpose.
- Portfolio, audition or writing submission.
- Résumé.
- For applicants to the Master of Arts in Teaching, GPA of at least 3.0 in undergraduate major and qualifying test scores.
- GRE scores. While not required of most applicants, submission of GRE scores is strongly encouraged for applicants to architectural history, art history, arts administration, cinema studies and postprofessional Master of Architecture degree programs.
- Additionally, if applicable, any other documents or materials required to obtain a student visa.
- Personal or telephone interview optional. (May be scheduled by contacting the admission department.)

Financial Aid and Scholarships

- Apply and be accepted to SCAD.
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Please include SCAD as one of your school choices, the code number is **015022**. Remember to use accurate tax information to answer all questions.
- If you receive a request for additional information from the Financial Aid Office please complete and return promptly.
- Within two to three weeks of filing your FAFSA you should receive a Student Aid Report (SAR). Please review for accuracy and submit any necessary corrections.
- An official award of financial assistance letter from SCAD will arrive via mail and e-mail soon. This letter will list all of your financial assistance including scholarships, grants and loans. The award notification is also posted in MySCAD for students who have paid their enrollment fee and have received their personal identification number.
