2014 IVY HALL YOUNG WRITERS WORKSHOP Wednesday, July 23-Friday, July 25

SCAD and the SCAD Writing Center at Ivy Hall invite Atlanta-area high school students to participate in a three-day workshop for budding writers, Wednesday, July 23, through Friday, July 25.

Developed and taught by the outstanding faculty in the SCAD writing department along with a guest writer, the Ivy Hall Young Writers Workshop is designed to help rising sophomores, juniors and seniors develop their skills as creative, descriptive writers. Workshops focus on a range of genres including fiction, creative nonfiction, poetry and writing for new media. The work of selected students is featured on the SCAD writing department's blog.

Atlanta-area high school students entering the 10th, 11th or 12th grade in Fall 2014 are invited to apply for admission to the workshop. Fifteen students will be selected based on the strength of their applications and writing samples.

The workshop concludes with student readings at a celebratory reception for faculty, family and friends the afternoon of Friday, July 25.

Laptop computers are available for student use.

Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis, and applicants will be notified of their acceptance approximately two weeks after submitting their applications.

All applications are due by Tuesday, July 1. The workshop fee is \$100.

WORKSHOP FACULTY

Catherine Ramsdell is a professor of writing at SCAD Atlanta. As an undergraduate, she majored in creative writing and marketing and earned an M.A. and Ph.D. in English. Ramsdell has more than a decade of college teaching experience, and she has taught courses such as Business and Professional Writing, Promotional Writing, Writing for the Web and Writing for New Media. She also writes for Popmatters.com, an online magazine of cultural criticism.

Terra Elan McVoy has held a variety of jobs centered around reading and writing, from managing an independent children's bookstore, to teaching writing classes and even answering fan mail for Captain Underpants. McVoy lives and works in the same Atlanta neighborhood where her novels "After the Kiss," "Being Friends with Boys" and "Pure" are set. She is also the author of "The Summer of Firsts and Lasts" and "Criminal."

Darby Sanders is a professor of writing at SCAD Atlanta and fiction writer. Sanders has an M.A. from Boston University and an M.F.A. from the University of Houston. From 2008-09, Sanders was a writer-in-residence at Salem College and a writing fellow at the Fine Arts Work Center in Provincetown, Massachusetts. He has also held residences at the MacDowell Colony and Djerassi Resident Artists Program. Winner of the Stanley Elkin Memorial Award for Short Fiction, Sanders' work can be found in literary journals such as The New Delta Review, The Colorado Review, West Branch, Grand Tour and BlueMesa Review. Sanders has also worked as a photographer, a Web designer and a documentary filmmaker.
